After civil war erupted in southern Sudan in the mid-1980s, 27,000 boys —many of them children—fled for refugee camps in Ethiopia and Kenya. These "Lost Boys" trekked thousands of miles across arid desert, and more than half perished along the way. In 2001 relief came, at least for some, when the U.S. government invited 4,000 exiles to immigrate to America, a journey captured in the National Geographic film *God Grew Tired of Us*.
